Current Status: Data & Privacy

- Regularly review, implement, and monitor enterprise-wide security policies and solutions

Current Status: Collaborative Leadership

- Collaborate with teachers to plan and implement instructional units that integrate the use of Library/Learning Commons resources and space

- Collaborate with K-6 Literacy Curriculum Support Teachers
- Coordinate weekly meetings with the Elementary Library Assistants
- Attend weekly District Librarian meetings
- Curate resources to send to teachers and share on Canvas



Current Status: Use of Space & Time

- Provide flexible spaces for all student learning styles
- Allow opportunities for students to use the Library/Learning Commons for class-related research, individual investigation, independent reading, and personal inquiry
- Organize the Library/Learning Commons in a logical system for students to access the resources
- Arrange the Library/Learning Commons for flexible use by large groups, small groups, and individuals
- Two full time certified librarians; each oversees one high school and two elementary schools
- Each full time certified librarian oversees 3 library assistants

Current Status: Literacy



- Review professional publications and attend webinars to keep up-to-date on current print and non-print resources
- Conduct ongoing collection analysis to guide purchasing decisions
- Assess student and teacher needs and interests using multiple formats (e.g. Google Form, teacher/student conversations)

- Create elementary library lessons that focus on:

 - Accessing and using digital resources for fiction and nonfiction reading
